Two pages, one flower. First a small finished preview — just so you know where you're headed. Then a full page, pale and patient, waiting for you.

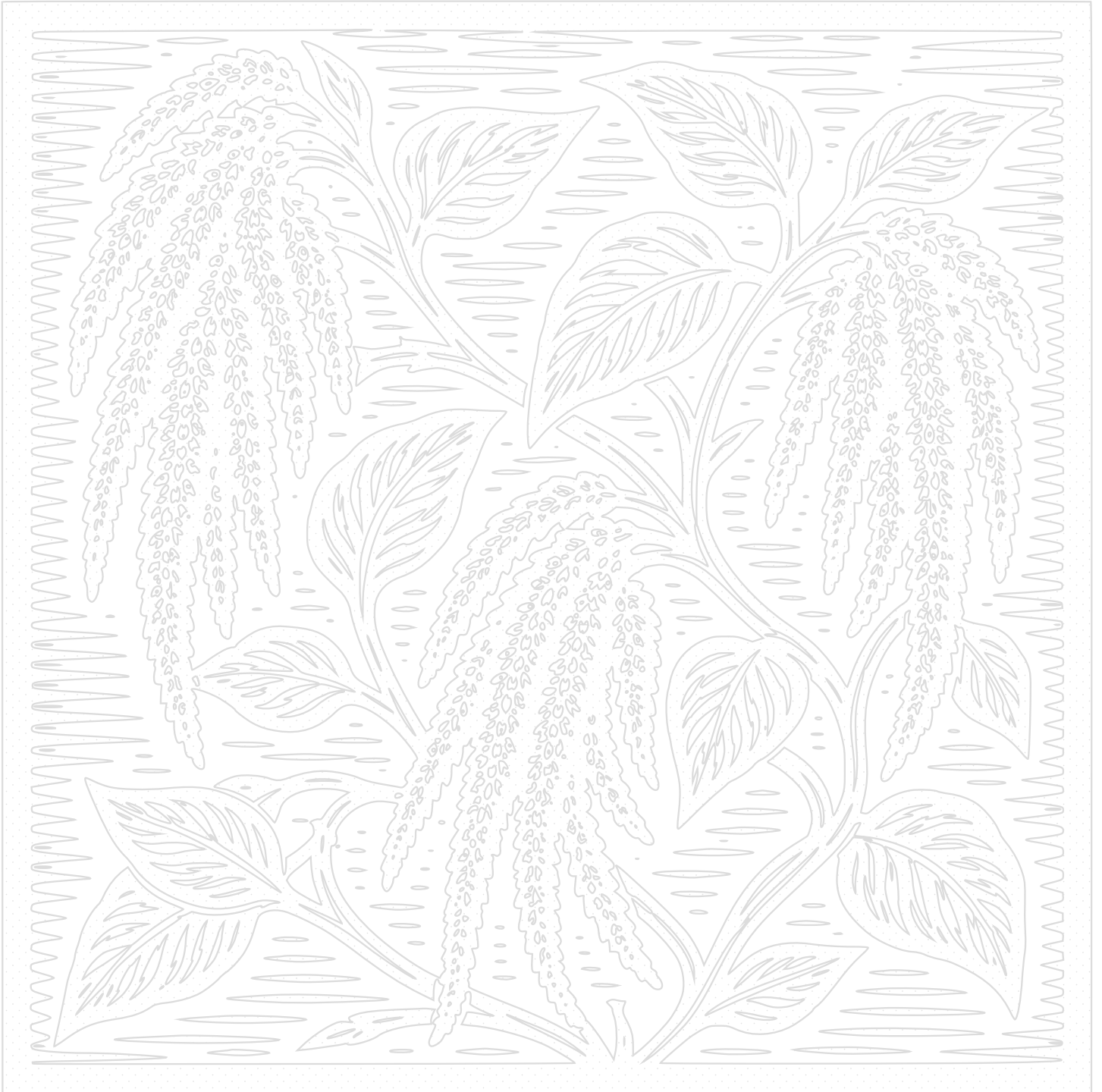

2. Cut it out. Once your flower is finished, follow the thin guide line with a pair of scissors. Slowly, carefully — like you mean it.

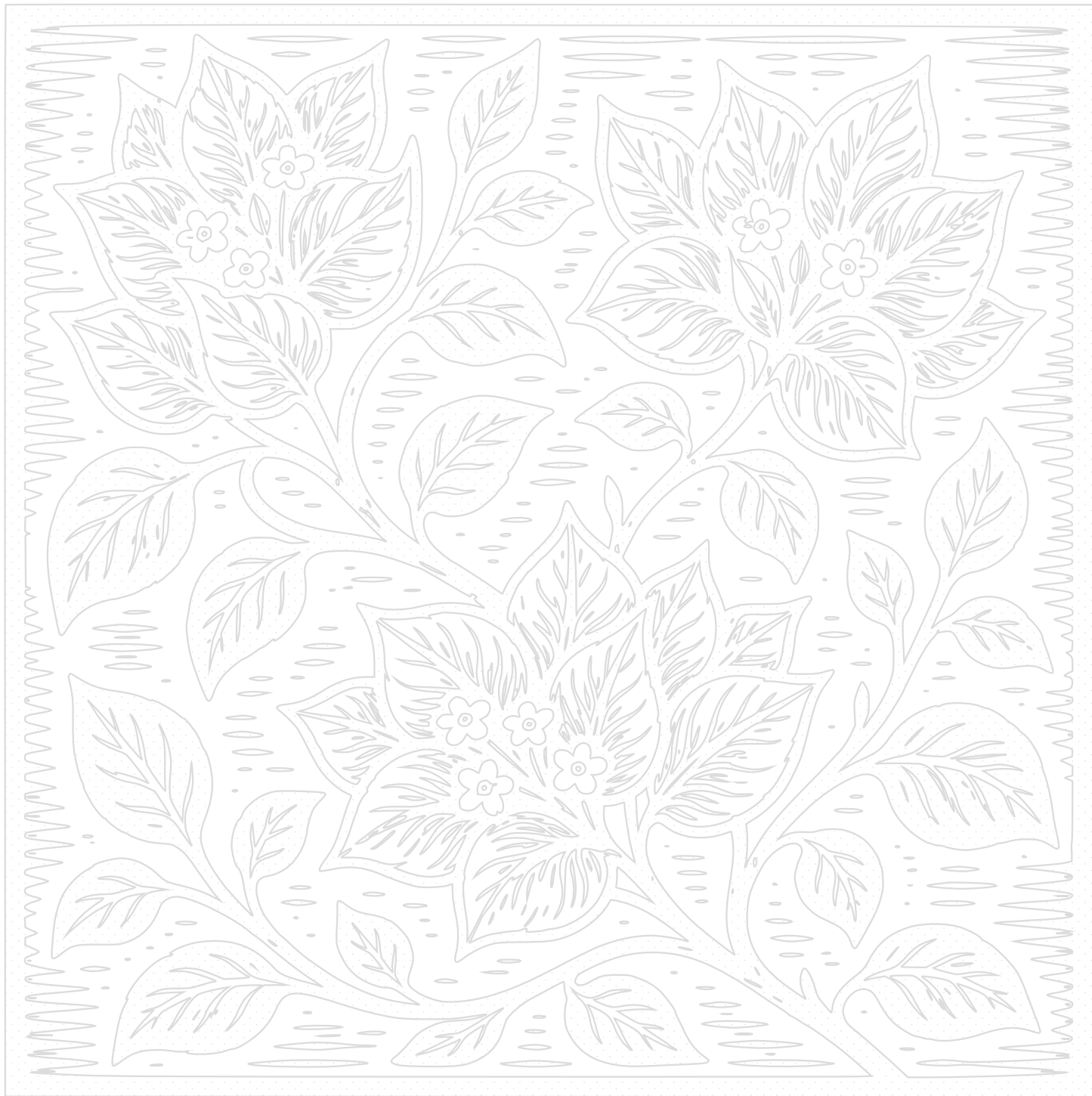
3. Frame it. Hang it, gift it, or stack it with the others until you build your own little paper garden.

No instructions to overthink, no rules to follow — just black shapes, white space, and however much color you feel like giving them today.





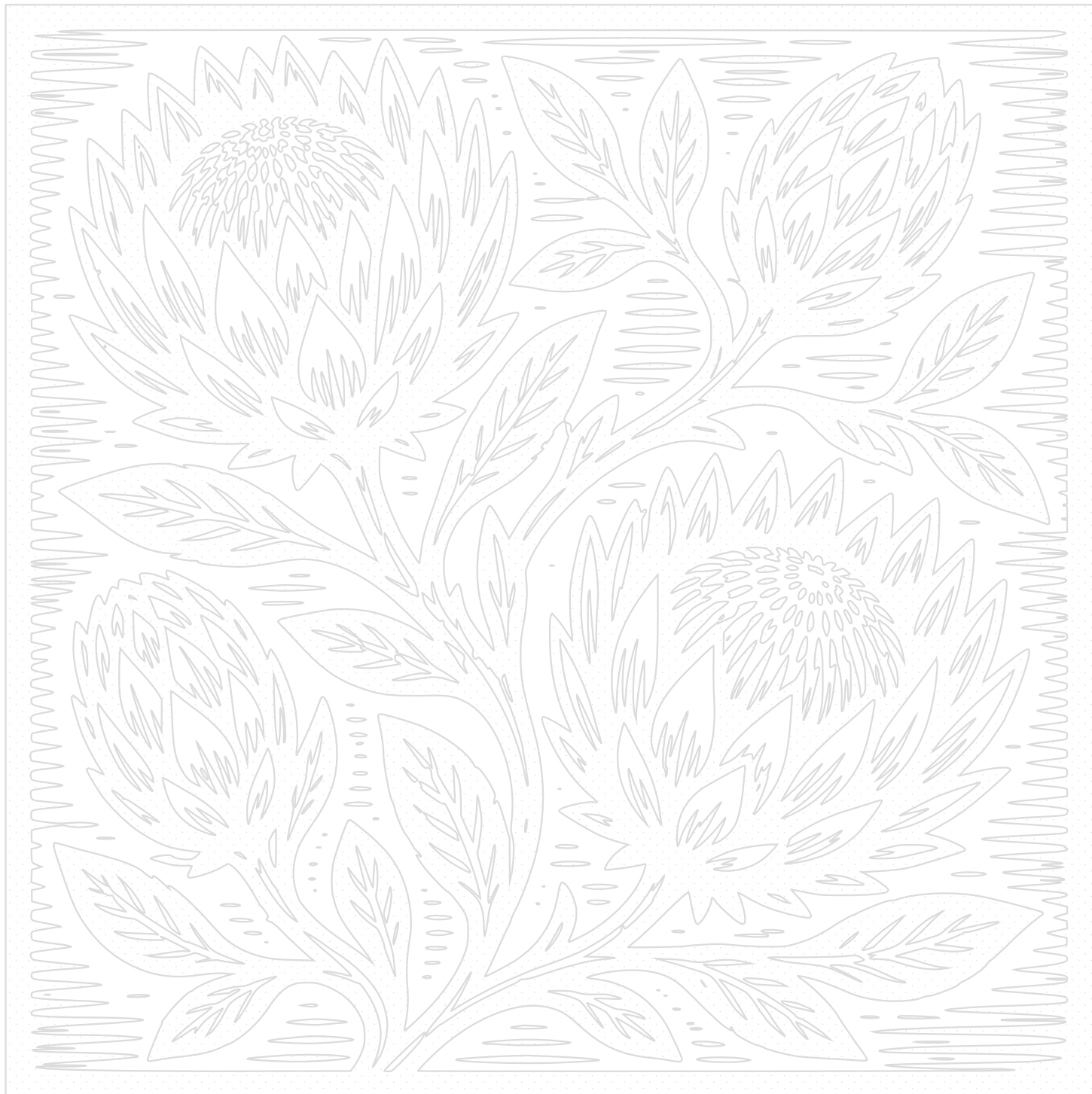












A Gift Before We Say Goodbye
